In November 2001, Flinders Ports acquired seven ports from the South Australian Government. In addition to the acquisition of the port infrastructure, it also acquired a 99-year land lease and port operating licences for the ports of Port Adelaide, Port Lincoln, Port Giles, Klein Point, Thevenard, Port Pirie and Wallaroo.

On this tour, LAA members will visit the site of Port Adelaide including the Outer Harbor which consists of the DP World Adelaide container terminal, the AAT import/export car facility and a deep sea grain berth.

Members will tour the **Port Adelaide Cargo** handling berths for Australian and International Trade including shipping containers; bulk cargo; break bulk cargo – grain, limestone, soda ash, cement, mineral sands, scrap metal, iron and steel product, fertiliser, motor vehicles, petroleum; and other project cargo such as mining equipment and wind farm equipment.

The site tour will also include the **DP World Adelaide Container Terminal** which boasts excellent direct on dock road and rail links with two berths currently providing 510m length and 14.2metre water depth alongside at low water. The berth will soon be extended by 150 metres, providing 660m of quayline and an order has been placed for 2 new post-panamax cranes planned for commission during the 1st/2nd quarter 2009.

The container terminal also provides intermodal facilities integrating it with the national road and rail system, enabling the efficient transfer of cargo. A transition area provides storage for 6,000 TEUs and includes 380 reefer plugs and a full range of quarantine, customs, fumigation and cleaning facilities are available.
